ROUNDABOUT SHOVEL READY

Construction of Myrtleford's new Standish Street roundabout is set to commence Monday 29th January with the aim of completion by Thursday 29 March Just in time for Easter.

Once complete, the roundabout will improve safety and traffic flow for Myrtleford.

The below traffic detours will be in place during this time:

- STANDISH STREET —— CLOSED at the Great Alpine Road, except during the Labour Day long weekend (9—12 March).
- ◆ BUFFALO RIVER ROAD detoured via Prince & King Streets or via Lewis Avenue.
- ◆ TOWN CENTRE TRAFFIC detoured via Prince & Smith Streets or via Clyde Street.
- GREAT ALPINE ROAD will remain OPEN to through traffic.

Valentine's Day, also called Saint Valentine's Day or the Feast of Saint Valentine, is an annual holiday celebrated on February 14. It originated as a Western Christian liturgical feast day honoring one or more early saints named Valentinus, and is recognized as a significant cultural and commercial celebration in many regions around the world, although it is not a public holiday in any country.

Several martyrdom stories associated with the various Valentines that were connected to February 14 were added to later martyrologies, including a popular hagiographical account of Saint Valentine of Rome which indicated he was imprisoned for performing weddings for soldiers who were forbidden to marry and for ministering to Christians, who were persecuted under the Roman Empire. According to legend, during his imprisonment, Saint Valentine healed the daughter of his jailer, Asterius, and before his execution, he wrote her a letter signed "Your Valentine" as a farewell.

The day first became associated with romantic love within the circle of Geoffrey Chaucer in the 14th century, when the tradition of courtly love flourished. In 18th-century England, it evolved into an occasion in which lovers expressed their love for each other by presenting flowers, offering confectionery, and sending greeting cards (known as "valentines"). In Europe, Saint Valentine's Keys are given to lovers "as a romantic symbol and an invitation to unlock the giver's heart", as well as to children, in order to ward off epilepsy (called Saint Valentine's Malady). Valentine's Day symbols that are used today include the heart-shaped outline, doves, and the figure of the winged Cupid. Since the 19th century, handwritten valentines have given way to mass-produced greeting cards. Saint Valentine's Day is an official feast day in the Anglican Communion and the Lutheran Church.
